Honored Guest Brigadier General (Retired) Oscar Bautista Hilman



Brigadier General (Retired)
Oscar Bautista Hilman

was born in the Republic of Philippines. He graduated from Central Washington University, and he received

his Masters of Science Degree in Strategic Science from the United States Army War College. He received his commission through the Officer Candidate School in 1977. His military education includes Armor Basic and Advanced Courses, Combined Arms Services Staff Course, United States Army Command and General Staff College, and the United States Army War College.

He served as Commanding General of the 81st Brigade Combat Team in support of Iraqi Freedom II operating in seven forward operating bases including Kuwait, Saudi Arabia, and Fort Lewis, WA. He retired as Deputy Commanding General, I Corps and Fort Lewis.

His awards and decorations include: Legion of Merit with Oak Leaf Cluster, Bronze Star Medal with Oak Leaf Cluster, the Meritorious Service Medal with 4 Oak Leaf Clusters, and the Combat Action Badge.

Brigadier General Hilman resides in Tacoma, Washington with his wife Patty. They have four children and nine grandchildren.###

Dr. Raquel R. Ramsey is the widow of Col. Edwin P. Ramsey, 26th Cavalry PS who led the Last Cavalry Charge in U.S. Army history and Commander of the East Central Luzon Guerilla Forces as he fought 4 years behind enemy lines. Col. Ramsey passed away last March 7, 2013 and was buried in Arlington National Cemetery on June 28, 2013 with full military honors.

Dr. Ramsey retired on June 15, 2013

after 50 years in the Education profession from Beverly Hills Unified School District where she was a teacher of English and Coordinator of the English Language Program for 23 years. She also taught English at the Yeshiva University High Schools of Los Angles, and International School in Manila. She had also been an instructor in several subjects at the University of Santo Tomas, where she obtained her degrees.

Raqui, as most people know her, has been actively engaged in several military organizations with Col. Ramsey like the Philippine Scouts Heritage Society, the U.S. Cavalry Association and on June 6, 2015 became an honorary cadet at the Oklahoma Military Academy



where her husband graduated. This year she will receive on behalf of her husband, The LTG William Potts Award of Excellence. He is at present honored with the Ed Ramsey Scholarship Endowment bringing back the cadet program (National Guard) in his memory.

Dr. Ramsey was Executive Producer of her husband's documentary, "NEVER SURRENDER: THE ED RAMSEY STORY" by Vanilla Fire

Production which premiered last Nov. 13, 2016. It is now entered in several Film Festivals and is shown in many Universities and Museums all over the U.S.

Raquel will continue to carry her husband's legacy and has fully committed herself to promoting the role that Filipinos and Americans played during World War II. As an educator, she was part of the Bataan Legacy Foundation which recommended changes to the CA Social Science Curriculum which passed and are now in the process of being implemented. This will bring awareness to future generations of students about the sacrifices that these men like Col. Ramsey, endured for the cause of freedom. ####

The Filipino World War II Veterans Congressional Gold Medal

On July 26, 1941, President Franklin D. Roosevelt issued a military order directing allorganized military forces be placed under the U.S. Army Forces in the Philippines commanded by General Douglas MacArthur. Over 260,000 soldiers fought alongside American soldiers under the U.S. Army Forces of the Far East (USAFFE). Some 60,000 of these soldiers died in combat, and thousands more were wounded for life or are still missing in action.

After the war, the Rescission Acts passed into law in February 18, 1946 repealed their veterans' benefits, and revoked their U.S. nationality status. The law severely devastated their morale and sense of allegiance to a country they served to protect and willingly died for. But they never wavered on their oath to serve. The interminable cost of their mission – the infamous Bataan Death March and guerrilla war, and brutal ordeal to defend the United States and Philippines were unprecedented.

On December 14, 2016, in one of his last official acts in office, President Obama signed into law the Filipino Veterans of World War II Act (Public Law 114-265). This seminal, historic event in American history was the culmination of 75 years of their perseverance, and support from the members of Congress to recognize the Filipino Veterans for their courageous and selfless service in defending the United States and the Philippines from July 26, 1941 to December 31, 1946.

The Congressional Gold Medal is one of the nation's highest distinguished awards bestowed to individuals, institutions, or groups that have performed an achievement that has an impact on American history and culture.

To celebrate and remember their story, a National Presentation will be held during the week of Oct. 23, 2017 in Washington, D.C. House Speaker Paul Ryan will formally recognize the Filipino Veterans of World War II with the Congressional Gold Medal. Attending this historic event are living veterans and their next of kin, members of Congress, community advocates and supporters, and Philippine Government dignitaries.

The Presentation will be followed with a formal celebration to demonstrate our nation's deepest appreciation and debt of gratitude for their incredible sacrifice. At this event, bronze replicas will be presented to living veterans and their next of kin.

The second phase is the development of a digital, interactive, web based, and accessible education program to perpetuate the legacy of the Filipino Veterans of WWII. This will be a joint project to include academic experts, community advocates, corporate sponsors, and individual donors. The overarching intent is to demonstrate the historical significance of Filipino Veterans of WWII Congressional Gold Medal, and the Veterans' wartime service.

Leading this initiative is the Filipino Veterans Recognition and Education Project (FilVetREP), a 501(c)(3) tax exempt, non-partisan, community-based education, and public charity organization. Its mission is to raise national awareness through academic research and public education on the wartime service and recognition of Filipino and Filipino American World War II soldiers who served from July 26, 1941 to December 31, 1946, and to celebrate and memorialize their outstanding accomplishments.


